What to be aware of concerning The Ministerial Order on the PhD Programme and The Collective Agreement for Academics

The Ministerial Order on the PhD Programme states that a PhD education consists of:

- Carrying out independent research work under supervision (the PhD project)
- Completion of a PhD thesis on the basis of the PhD project,
- Participation in courses, change of research environment and knowledge dissemination related to the project

For PhD students employed under the Collective agreement for Academics, an 840 hour work rules also applies.

On the next page is a chart that outlines rules and regulations for PhD education with the Ministerial Order as framework. Within that framework, UCPH has constituted the some university-wide minimum rules. In addition, each faculty can lay down its own supplementary provisions.

COURSES

The Ministerial Order

• Complete PhD courses or similar study elements totalling approx. 30 ECTS points.

UCPH rules

- Courses must be approved by the PhD committee.
- The Faculty can determine the rules for participation in courses outside the University.
- · Courses can be specific or more generic.
- UCPH is obligated to offer a course in dissemination.
- A course in ethics and good scientific practices is mandatory for all PhD students.
- The Faculty determine the rules for the composition of the course program.

CHANGE OF RESEARCH ENVIRONMENT

The Ministerial Order

• Participate in active research environments', including stays at other, mainly foreign, research institutions, private research enterprises etc.

UCPH rules

- No requirement to the extent and can be met in many ways.
- Must be adapted to the research project.
- Going abroad is not a requirement but should be aimed at.

KNOWLEDGE DISSEMINATION

The Ministerial Order

• Gain experience of teaching activities or other form of knowledge dissemination which is related to the student's PhD project.

UCPH rules

- There is no rule for the extent of the experience.
- There is a difference between the 840 hour rule and this experience; however, they can be united if teaching is part of the 840 hours.
- Must be related to the research project.

840 HOUR RULE

Collective agreement for Academics/ UCPH rules

- The PhD student is obligated to do 840 hours of work.
- The University is obligated to pay full salary even if it does not use all 840 hours.
- In special cases, a reduction in the 840 hours with a similar reduction in pay can be granted. (0 hours = reduction of 1/6 of the PhD salary).
